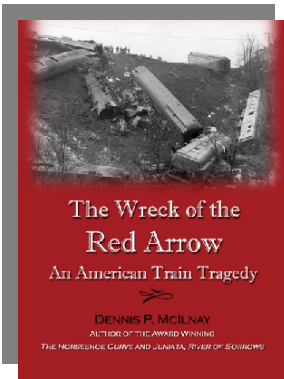


# Winter Evening History Talks
